READING COMPREHENSION GOAL

As we move into the 3rd year of our four year goal, staff continue to teach various reading strategies that will assist our students to improve their reading comprehension.

By teaching students various strategies to help them better

understand what they are reading, all students will eventually have a wide range of strategies which they can use when picking up any book to read and understand. Some of the strategies that will be specifically taught this year include Connecting, Asking Questions, Visualizing, Inferring, Accessing Prior Knowledge and Summarizing/Synthesizing. For the third year of our four year goal, we will focus a little deeper on Visualizing and Inferring strategies.

KINDERGARTEN LUNCH LEADERS

We have been fortunate to have such a dedicated group of grade six students who have been buddies with our youngest students, as they became familiar with the routines in our school during the lunch breaks. The kindergarten students looked forward to both the play and eating time that they spent with their older buddies during the four week time frame and they continue to enjoy eating lunch with them each and every day. 

The library would like to thank the Briden Family and the Robertson Family for donating books!!!


Our Scholastic Bookfair was a huge success!! We were able to buy tons of new books for our library!! Thanks to the volunteers who helped make the fair run smoothly!!



KEEPING OURSELVES HEALTHY

Flu season is quickly approaching! One of the best ways to keep ourselves healthy is to wash our hands on a regular basis.

When Do You Wash Your Hands?

- before handling food
- before eating
- after sneezing, coughing or shaking hands
- after using the washroom

How Do You Wash Your Hands?

- use soap and warm running water
- rub your hands vigorously
- wash all surfaces including backs of hands, wrists, between the fingers, fingertips and under fingernails
- rinse well
- dry hands with a <u>clean</u> towel or paper towel

 turn off the tap using the towel instead of your bare hands – remember, you turned the tap on with dirty hands!

HEAD LICE – "ANYONE" CAN GET THEM

- Outbreaks of head lice have occurred frequently in schools in recent years.
- Outbreaks are more common following busy vacation times.
- ♦ Your help is needed to prevent and control outbreaks of head lice.
- Please check your child's head every week for head lice
- Please call the school if your child has head lice.
- ◆ Your child and other household members with head lice need to be treated at the same time. You child needs treatment before returning to school.
- For more information on head lice and treatment, call your school or health unit.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR:

- ◆ The adult louse is a small, wingless insect (3mm or 1/8 inch in length).
- ♦ It is very fast and not always seen.
- ◆ Look for nits (eggs) of the louse very tiny (.08 mm or 1/32 inch).
- Nits may be white, yellow or brown.
- Found firmly attached to the hair, close to the scalp.
- May look like dandruff but cannot be flicked off like dandruff.
- Nits can be removed by sliding them off the end of the hair shaft.




